- This two day training course will cover three core areas of knowledge that will aid the Phototherapy nurse in delivering a safe and effective treatment. The course will be of benefit to Dermatology nurses and Physiotherapists.
- The biological effects of Ultraviolet light on skin and the various diseases that can be treated with ultraviolet light therapy will be covered. The use of Psoralens and other potential photosensitisers and their pharmacology will be discussed. In addition the biological principles behind effective dose management will be outlined.
- The Physics of Ultraviolet light will be introduced and the various types of light treatment discussed. Equipment encountered by the Phototherapy nurse will be described, including both therapy equipment such as treatment cabins and Ultraviolet light detection equipment such as UV meters. A thorough grounding in exposure time and dose calculations will be given through lectures and workshops. The safe use of Ultraviolet therapy for both patient and staff will be discussed, with reference to available guidelines and best practice.
- Various important aspects of delivering a safe and effective service to the patient will be discussed, in particular practical guides to PUVA, broadband and narrowband UVB treatments. Four workshops have been designed to help put some of the theory into practice. The role of the Phototherapy nurse will be outlined, including management of unexpected treatment outcomes. The general experience gained by staff at the St John's Institute of Dermatology will also be discussed.
- A certificate of attendance will be provided on the completion of this course.
- This course is limited to 60 delegates
